NEW FROM APRIL 2015 - THE HOWDEN YOUTH RECREATION PROJECT

The young people of Howden were disappointed when they learned that their long standing Youth Club run by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council was to close at the end of December 2014. However, it was all cheers when Howden Town Council announced that they would provide a new club to replace it!

The Howden Youth Recreation Project (YRP) will open its doors to young people aged between 13 and 19 from the Howden area in April. Located in the same purpose built accommodation within the grounds of Howden School that was home to the Youth Club, the YRP will provide young people with an opportunity to take part in a range of recreation activities every Wednesday evening between 7-9pm.

The Youth Recreation Project Leader

and an Assistant Leader were appointed in March and the Project will open its doors for the first time on Wednesday 15th April. Those attending will pay £1 per session towards the cost of resources. Some young people have already offered to work as volunteer assistant leaders for the Project in order to enhance their own skills and to help the Project develop. It is hoped that in the near future the Project will also offer activities for those in the 11-12 age group.

Jane Breach (the new Project Leader) and Jean Hill (Assistant Leader) look forward to welcoming all young people to the Recreation Project on the opening night.

NEWS FROM THE ASHES

Last summer we informed you that there had been a considerable amount of damage to the equipment in the children's play area in the park. Since then we have had a sub group working with Paul Varney from Groundworks. Paul and Groundworks assist groups/charities to locate and obtain funding for projects. As reported in the local media last month we have been successful with grant applications and now have funds to completely replace all of the worn equipment (in excess of £65,000). The work to replace the equipment will be taking place around Easter with the intention (fingers crossed) that we can have a formal opening on Sunday 3rd May 2015 before the Mayfest concert in the park.

The layout of the new equipment was chosen by local junior school pupils with over 90% in favour of the selected design.

Many of you will have seen in the media a report on the passing of Howden Town Councillor Daphne D'Ark. Not only was Daphne a Councillor she was also a trustee on the Ashes Trust. Daphne worked tirelessly for the town and could always be seen during town functions in the Market Place at the closure onto Bridgegate (Yes the white haired old lady with the walking stick). She was kind, generous with her money and her time and she will be greatly missed by everyone who knew her.

To remember Daphne the Ashes Playing Field Trust have decided to name the new play area "The Daphne D'Ark Play Area" and we will arrange for a plaque to be sited in the area to commemorate this.

As many of you will have seen we have had the tree surgeons in the park to carry out annual maintenance on the trees. The trees have to be pruned or trimmed to maintain their health. Unfortunately from time to time we have to remove a tree, usually for safety reasons. Trees do get disease, rot or just die. Due to the size of them if they are



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subject to rot or disease that can't be resolved, then a decision is made to cut them down. Before we do this we notify the ERYC planning department who give permission for the work to be done. Every time we remove a tree we are contacted by a number of you with concerns. Please be assured we have no desire to remove trees unnecessarily and it is done only as a last resort.

To compensate some of the trees that have been removed we are currently surveying the park with a view to a replanting of some new species. As we did a few years ago we will be asking if anyone wishes to donate the cost and have a tree planted to commemorate someone or just because they would like to help.

Finally, as mentioned earlier we will be holding The Mayfest in the park outside of the pavilion again at 2pm on Sunday the 3rd

NEW TOWN DEFIBRILLATOR

Suspect someone is having a heart attack? Howden's Community Public Access Defibrillator is here to help......

Due to a fabulous fund raising effort, Howden now has a Community Public Access Defibrillator (cPAD). cPADs are easy to use, compact, portable and very effective. They are designed to be used by lay persons; the machines guide the operator through the process by verbal instructions and visual

prompts. They are safe and will not allow a shock to be given unless the heart's rhythm requires it. They are designed to be stored for long periods without use and require very little routine maintenance.

The cPADs across the region are operated in partnership with Yorkshire Ambulance Service. The ambulance service records the cabinet location and access code in its control room, so that May 2015. There will be live music, food outlets, some children's entertainment and a bar and what's more its free to enter...... yes you can just walk in!!! We would like to see as many of you as possible there (weather permitting) and at the formal opening of the play area beforehand.

operators can enable members of the general public, responding to a suspected cardiac arrest, to access the defibrillator. In the event of an emergency, dial **999** for an ambulance. The operator assesses the situation and, if appropriate, provides the caller with the combination code to access the cPAD which is located next to the Shire Hall office in the centre of the Market Place.



ARE YOU PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY?

Howden Town Council has been working with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to produce a local emergency plan. This does not mean we are about to be flooded or about to be cut off by heavy snow. The plan is there so when something drastic does happen and the emergency services can't respond immediately, they can call upon a local team to assist, if and only if an incident occurs in Howden at the same time as they are busy elsewhere. DOG FOULING

Dog mess is an eyesore and a health hazard.

If you are a dog owner, you have a legal duty to clean up every time your dog messes in a public place. Registered blind people are not required to clean up after their guide dogs.

•Councils can issue dog control orders against individual dog owners for offences including allowing a dog to foul a public space.

•Councils can issue fixed penalty orders in relation to dog control orders. Where there is no local rate, the fixed penalty is \pounds_{75} .

•In very serious cases, magistrates can issue a maximum penalty of £1,000.

If you see an owner walking away from their dog's mess, please ring (01482) 396301 and report it to ERYC Dog Wardens.



CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE REVIEW

A review of the CPZ has been promised by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council for over a year now. A draft of the CPZ review questionnaire was commented on by Howden Town Council in early 2014 and it has taken East Riding Council all this time to address the comments made. At last a revised questionnaire has been circulated around all the residents and businesses in the CPZ. It is very important that you all respond as the changes proposed by the East Riding Council will affect you all, whether it be where and for how long you can park or the cost of permits. Please look at the bigger picture and have your say. Unfortunately the CPZ review does not address the two pay and display car parks. They will have to be reviewed at a later date. However if you have comments to make regards the links between the CPZ and the car parks please make them known. Cars parked on the streets are not just those of PA employees, they could be visitors, shoppers or belong to other businesses in Howden who do not have anywhere else to park or cannot afford the charges in the car parks.
